



Birth certificates provide access to social services and legal documents.


Death certificates are required for burial and for settling property transfers.

- Ministerial Declaration to 'Get Every One in the Picture' in Asia and the Pacific
- Regional Action Framework comprising:
 - 3 Goals
 - 15 targets set individually by countries
 - 7 Action Areas
 - 8 implementation steps



Current CRVS status





- Far from universal birth registration, in particular among vulnerable groups
- ID systems are sometimes being implemented in parallel
- Low rates of death registration
- Only a few countries have complete data on causes of death
- Vital statistics is rarely produced based on CR data

The Regional CRVS Partnership

- Up to 22 organizations involved
- Ensure alignment of activities to avoid overlaps and gaps, frequently requested by countries
- Knowledge sharing
- 8 Institutional members of the Regional Steering Group, which also includes 22 country officials and meet yearly.
