





CVRS SYSTEM – MAIN AGENCIES



Agencies, Their Main Roles & Responsibilities

- MoH:
 - Managing the births and death dataset and quality assurance of the data
 - Analysis and dissemination of vital statistics
- Government Hospitals/ Health Centres:
 - Registration of birth/death.
 - Fill the forms and send to DNR.
- Private Hospitals:
 - Complete Birth and Death form in triplicate copies (Parent, DNR, Local Council)




Agencies, Their Main Roles & Responsibilities

Island Council

- Check whether all the pink and yellow copies of all the birth/death forms has been received
- File the pink copy.
- Forwarding the yellow copies to Atoll council to send to DNR.
- Issue birth certificate in the locality.

Atoll Councils

- Collect all the yellow copies from all the islands in the Atoll and forward it to DNR.
- Male' City Council
 - Registration of births and issuance of birth certificates in Male'.
 - Male' City Council has access to DNR system to get into the VRS online
 - Generate National ID number.



Agencies, Their Main Roles & Responsibilities

- Maldives Police Service (MPS):
 - Stamp white death certificate before the burial.
- Cemeteries
 - Ensure certified white copy is received before burial
- DNR:
 - Managing the births and death form entry
 - Data Quality (logistical & administrative side)



CRVS Coordination Mechanism

 - High-Level CRVS Coordination mechanism at National Level with policy and technical representation

Objectives

- Strengthen the CRVS system in the country
- Improve interagency coordination
- Address the challenges and new requirements in the system

- Oversee capacity building



CRVS Coordination Mechanism

Formal mechanisms

- Legislature: VRS Regulation, Local Government Act, Mandates of Agencies
- Interagency MOU. Eg: MoH and DNR

Communication across and within

- Formal communication, mostly through electronic means
- Information System

Terms of Refence

- Partial:
 - MOU between MoH and DNR
 - Administrative understanding between MoH and LGA
 - Mandate of individual institutions, departments and divisions

Coordination Monitoring Mechanism

- CRVS Coordination committee monitors on a high level
- MoH Health facilities for birth and Dealth (also Police for death)
- DJA Marriage registrations at courts
- Periodic Reports
- Quarterly Meetings

Effectiveness of the Coordination Mechanisms: Important Gains

- Coordinating mechanism established
- Completeness of birth, marriage and death registration
- Legislative changes brought
- Able to address maternal deaths efficiently (Next working day)
- Improved infant and maternal mortality rates
- Introduced modern system for information management
- Published first VRS Report

Challenges

- Formalization of the National coordination mechanism (Authority)
- Enhancing the information management systems for greater coverage, accuracy, and timeliness
- Strengthen both inter and intra agency coordination
- Registration of Overseas Birth, Death, and Marriages events
- Timeliness in disseminating VRS statistics
- Harmonizing legal framework
- Sustainable Human Capital Development Program
- Improving COD identification and coding
- Strengthening of National Statistical System
