The City Civil Registrar refers to the head of the local civil registry office of the city or municipality who is appointed as such by the city or municipal mayor in accordance with the provisions of existing laws and technically under supervision of the National Statistician and Civil Registrar General. Civil Registry System (CRS) Outlet in Muntinlupa — is one of the PSA CRS outlets in Metro Manila (National Capital Region), responsible for the catering of copy issuance of certifications and authentication of birth, marriage, death certificates and Certificate of No Marriage or CENOMAR to walk-in clients. PhilSys Registration Center — a PSA satellite for the Philippine Identification System or PhilSys registration, where data are encoded and biometric information of applicants are captured in the System.
