Why the 2025 Ministerial Conference?



Celebrate achievements of the CRVS Decade

The Third Ministerial Conference enables members and associate members of ESCAP to reflect and celebrate the progress made throughout the Decade.



Identify areas of support to realize all goals and targets

Based on the 2025 review, the Ministerial Conference allows leaders to identify areas requiring additional attention to accelerate efforts and realize the remaining goals and targets under the 2014 Ministerial Declaration and Regional Action Framework.



Why the 2025 Ministerial Conference? Cont'd



Identify key actions to ensure inclusive and resilient CRVS systems

Also based on the 2025 review, the Ministerial Conference offers an opportunity to establish key actions and enhance commitment to establish and maintain inclusive and resilient CRVS systems as a foundation for legal identity for all.



Formally extend the CRVS Decade to align with the 2030 Agenda

With the adoption of the 2025 Ministerial Declaration, the Third Ministerial Conference will officially extend the CRVS Decade to align with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development



Expected outcomes

2025 Ministerial Declaration

Extend the Asia-Pacific CRVS Decade to 2030

Inclusivity and resilience as two particular focus



Format of the Ministerial Conference

- ◆ In-person at the UNCC, Bangkok, from 24 to 26 June 2025
- ◆ Co-organizers: CDC, CRC Asia, GHAI, SPC, Statistics Norway, UNDP, UNFPA, UNHCR, UNICEF, Vital Strategies, WHO, and World Vision
- ◆ Government delegations will comprise of Heads of Government, Ministers of Interior, Health and Planning, and high-level government officials from civil registration, health, statistics, national ID, digitalization and planning sectors.
- ◆ Senior representatives of partner organizations, non-governmental organizations and civil society will participate.
- ◆ The media will be invited to cover the event.
- ◆ It is expected that between 300 to 400 people will join the Ministerial Conference.



Format of the Ministerial Conference (Cont'd)

- ◆ A Youth and Civil Society (YCS) forum will occur before the Conference (March 2025). Additional consultations with these groups will occur before the forum.
- ◆ Sub-regional and sectoral forums (23 June 2025) to facilitate partnership and experience sharing on civil registration, health and statistics.
- ◆ **Senior-officials segment (two days Tuesday to Wednesday 24-25 June 2025)** to review progress and identify key actions on inclusion and resilience. The segment would also review the draft outcome document of the Ministerial Conference.
- ◆ **Ministerial segment (one day, Thursday 26 June 2025)** to witness statements from governments, high-level panel and keynote speaker(s), and the adoption of the Ministerial Declaration.
- ◆ Exhibitions, side events, receptions, and others (all week) and donor conference (Friday 27 June 2025)
